HE DISAPPEARS NEAR MOLINO EARLY TODAY

Window Of Pullman Found
Broken; Hat Is Left
On Seat

The Louisville and Nashville railway detective bureau and county officers were combined today in a search for a man who disappeared from a Pullman coach of a passenger train between Molino and Cantonment early this morning.

The only identification known to officers is that the missing man is a Mr. Cooper, of Holt, Fla. He is an elderly man.

Near Molino

He is known to have made several trips to an unknown point in Alabama for treatment for a cancer on his face. He was last noticed on the train when it stopped at Molino.

Then as the train neared Cantonment a window of his Pullman coach, which he then occupied alone, was noticed broken out and his hat lay on the seat. He carried no traveling baggage.

The crew then made a search of the train and finding no more traces of him, notified the L. & N. officers in Pensacola. Agent Crawford, of the L. & N., and Deputy Sheriff J. L. Wiggins went to look for him.

Follow Tracks

Railway employes on motor cars rode the track while Deputy Wiggins and Agent Crawford rode the highway and inquired for trace of him at points between Pensacola and Flomaton but without success.

Employes on the motor cars especially watched for traces along the track for the point where he might have jumped from the train but saw none.

He is believed to have been unhurt in his escape from the train.

L. & N. officials say he had a ticket for passage as far as Holt, his home.

James Fountain Cooper
was 71 when this happened.
